Report for Annual Parish Meeting at 7.30pm Tuesday 31st May 2022 at The Tayne Centre by Rosemary Selman, Secretary

After 18 months of lockdown due to Covid 19, Lyminge Historical Society made the decision to re-start our monthly talks in October 2021.

Since resuming, it has been noticeable that the Membership has shrunk and of those that have decided to continue, there has been a marked drop in numbers who wish to venture out in the evenings.
