1.	<b>Policy: Biodiversity and wildlife corridors</b>	<b>The policy would map out the green (and blue) infrastructure and demonstrate how it can be safeguarded, expanded, better connected etc. May be scope to identify biodiversity opportunity areas.</b>
2.	Show on a map the green and blue corridors/ spaces plus where greater connectivity could be achieved.	Map
3.	Create a list of the natural features of the landscape that are particularly important in the area.	Photo of each type. Description. E.g. bluebell woods, trees, hedges, ponds etc.

5.	<b>Policy: Local Green Spaces</b> To safeguard demonstrably special green space from inappropriate development.	Identify and justify against the criteria. Provide photos and show them on a map. Collate ownership details and contact the owners.
6.	<b>Policy: Significant Local Views</b> To identify views that are particularly special and safeguard from the impacts of development.	Identify the key views that should be protected. For each, we need a description and photo and a map showing the location, direction and breadth of the view.
7.	<b>Policy: Dark skies</b>	CPRE mapping, any other local evidence
8.	<b>Policy: Energy efficiency and design - seek to ensure that development meets the highest environmental standards in terms of its construction, materials and energy use.</b>	<b>Much of the information to underpin such a policy is in the public domain.</b>
